Proposal type	Details
	This regulatory proposal has been assessed by RSHQ as minor and has zero/negligible regulatory costs—that is, it corrects a previous drafting error.
	The Queensland Treasury Principles for Fees and Charges required that by 1 July 2022, all in-scope fees captured by the Government's indexation policy would be displayed as a number of fee units (rather than a dollar amount) in agencies' respective regulations, unless an exemption has been provided.
	The Resources Safety and Health Legislation (Fee Unit Conversion) Amendment Regulation 2022 commenced on 10 June 2022 and implemented the above requirement by amending the regulatory fees in subordinate legislation administered by RSHQ. In relation to the Petroleum and Gas (Safety) Regulation 2018 (the P&G Regulation), this amendment regulation provided that:
Minor and machinery in nature	<ul> <li>the methane/biogas fees prescribed under sch 6, pt 3, s 14 of the P&amp;G Regulation would convert to fee units on 1 July 2023 as an exemption was granted by Queensland Treasury until then.</li> </ul>
/	<ul> <li>all other relevant fees prescribed under the P&amp;G Regulation would convert to fee units on 1 July 2022.</li> </ul>
	However, an earlier regulation—the Resources Legislation (Safety and Health Fees) Amendment Regulation 2021—was scheduled to commence amendments to the methane/biogas fees provision in schedule 6, part 3, section 14 of the P&G Regulation on 1 July 2022. Due to a drafting error there was an unintended consequence where the conversion to fee units for methane/biogas was cancelled out by the other regulation.
	This regulatory proposal will correct this drafting error, by converting the current methane/biogas fees prescribed under sch 6, pt 3, s 14 of the P&G Regulation to fee units.
